As a result of attending Wood Badge, you will be able to:

- View scouting globally, as a family of interrelated, values-based programs that provide age-appropriate activities for youth.

- Apply the skills you learn from your participation as a member of a successful working team.

## How is WOOD BADGE Presented?

Wood Badge consists of two phases. The first is the *practical phase*. This consists of two full weekends at camp plus a midweek patrol meeting between the weekends (may be held via email/Skype/conference call). The second, or *application phase*, occurs after the weekends and consists of "working your ticket", a set of five Scouting-related goals.

## What Are The Course Objectives

- ✓ To develop better understanding of the purpose & goals of the Scouting program and how they are attained.
- ✓ To learn the techniques of Leadership Training and Unit Operations
- ✓ To share in the fun and fellowship of an exciting council training course.
- ✓ To provide a common foundation of leadership and team skills used throughout all program areas.

## What Will I Be Doing?

- Camping as a patrol – At the beautiful Ben Delatour Scout Ranch, in walled tents on raised wooden platform, with heated showers, electricity and indoor toilets. For weekend 2 you will have outdoor toilets, with access to heated showers and electricity.
- Eating delectable, healthy meals prepared by the Quarter Master staff on the first weekend, and preparing meals with your patrol on the second weekend.
- Learning outdoor skills and leadership techniques in a "living" hands-on environment.
- Experience Cutting Edge Communication skills training from nationally trained scouters.
- Enjoying the majestic mountain peaks, the wonders of wildflowers and the beautiful forests of the Red Feathers Lake area.
- Developing friendships that will last a lifetime.

## Who Attends WOOD BADGE?

Wood Badge for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century has been developed for **all** Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout and Venturing leaders, as well as council and district leaders. The course content, and team leadership principles introduced apply to Scouters in all leadership positions.

## Qualifications

To attend a Wood Badge course, you must:

1. Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. (There is no minimum tenure required.)

3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. Successful completion of the BSA Annual Health and Medical Record, Part A, B, & C is required for all participants.

## WOOD BADGE Ticket

The primary purpose of the Wood Badge experience is to strengthen Scouting in units, districts, and the council. The Wood Badge "ticket" represents your commitment to complete a set of 5 personal goals related to your Scouting position. These goals will significantly strengthen the program in which you are involved. In addition, the ticket gives you an opportunity to practice and demonstrate a working knowledge of the leadership and team skills presented during the course.

## Recognition

Upon completion of the Wood Badge ticket you will be presented your Wood Badge certificate, neckerchief, woggle, and beads at a public Scouting ceremony. Many Scouters consider Wood Badge to be one of the highlights of their Scouting careers. It has served as a source of training and inspiration to thousands. In return:
